“One community with strong neighborhoods” is one of the strategic goals that have been adopted by the Glendale City Council. Our neighborhoods are the cornerstone of our city and are vital to maintaining a strong community. As part of our commitment to revitalizing and preserving our more established neighborhoods, we have developed the Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program. Through this program, individual neighborhoods can plan and receive grant funds for a variety of revitalization efforts.



One hundred and seventy-one grants have been awarded since the inception of the Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program in Fiscal Year 1994-95. Projects have taken place in neighborhoods throughout Glendale and include activities such as landscaping, sidewalk installation, street repairs and more.



A Citizen’s Advisory Commission oversees the grant requests and makes recommendations to myself and council so that we can make an informed final decision. On Tuesday, June 26 we approved the recommendations for four new grant projects to be funded in the upcoming fiscal year.



A neighborhood that is registered with the Neighborhood Partnerships Department is eligible to apply for an improvement grant if it is at least 15 years old and has a minimum of 20 homes. Projects that are most likely to be funded are ones that result in a benefit that can be enjoyed by the general public.
